- Did you have any problems with this exercise?

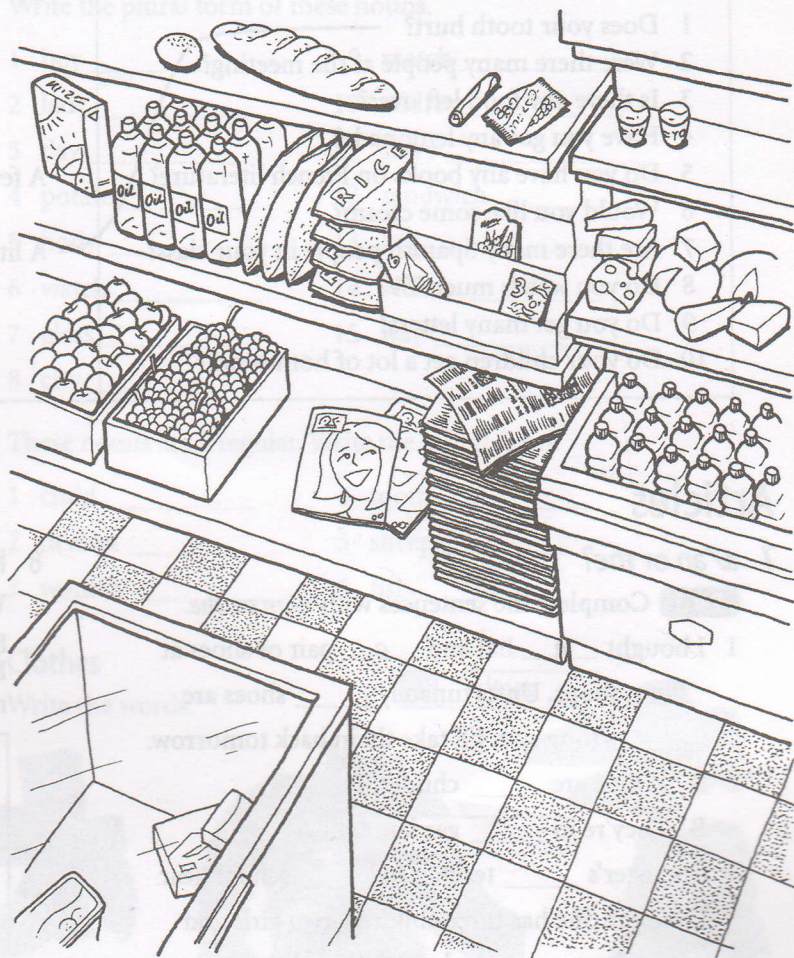
